



Nursery Curriculum Plan for Autumn term 2017



Illness and collection:

If your child is ill, please telephone the school office on the first day of the absence. Registers have to be kept daily and we need to include absences with reasons. May we also remind you that we finish at 11.30am and 3.30pm. Please do your best to collect on time.



Books and Reading:

Your child will be bringing home a story book on Tuesday and Thursday. Children usually enjoy and benefit from a regular time to share the book with your child. As the years go on this will become a natural time to listen to your child read when they bring home reading books. If your child does not attend on either of these days, please see a member of staff at the beginning or end of the next session to help you change it.



What your child needs to bring to school:

Your child needs to bring their book bag to school every day. They also need spare clothes in school every day, which can be left in a named draw string bag on your child's peg. If you need to buy either of these then they are available online from Tesco – www.tesco.com/ues



Clothes:

Your child may need warm clothes this term, especially when the weather gets colder, and also sensible shoes in which they can run and climb. **The outdoor space can be wet and muddy so you may like to send in Wellington boots (clearly named please) for your child to wear outside.** *Any outgrown Wellington boots will be gratefully received, for others to borrow.*

Dinner sessions are £3:00 per day including a school lunch. Please pay either in class, at the main school office or online via Parentpay. Please complete the lunch menus and return to school by Thursday morning. If your child does not attend on a Thursday morning or is away ill you can phone through their lunch choices to the office staff.

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Our Curriculum:

Our work this half term will be focussed around nursery rhymes. All work will be based around the 7 areas of the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum (EYFS) which are:

- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Communication and Language (Speaking and listening)
- Physical Development
- Literacy (Reading and writing)
- Numeracy
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design (Creative activities including role play, art, music and dancing)
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Within planned learning we will be focussing on colour, shape recognition, listening skills, pencil control, counting to 5, scissor skills and name recognition.
