Two training sessions are to be held in school for all school staff to access with a follow up session three weeks later. Headteachers Report	<ul> <li>The Headteachers report was circulated prior to the meeting and KTr reported that:         <ul> <li>Contextual data currently 523 children in school including nursery, places across school will be full, a further 30 children are due in so numbers will be higher</li> <li>54% of EAL children across school, Pakistani is the highest with 43% followed by 20% who are White British</li> </ul> </li> <li>Pupil Premium reports will be shared at School Effectiveness Committee. The impact report is on the school website. The report for this year's grant is on the school website and the Assistant Heads will focus on 'Barriers of Learning' for children. Both Assistant Heads have attended a course to look at 'Effective use of Pupil Premium'. David Turner from School Improvement will meet with both Assistant Heads to look at Pupil Premium. Governors asked – Where are the current hot spots in school – Currently Y6 low attainers, Y2 high achievers, Greater Depth.</li> <li>Behaviour - PJ – Transition meetings took place in July between the Reception and Year 1 teams to support the 2 high needs children in school. Both children started the year on part-time timetables. One of these children has settled in well. Across school, teachers are linking the Thorpe Expectations to the Rights Respecting Articles. Introduced 'Destination reader' across the school, in particular to years 2 to 6. Staff meetings and CPD sessions are planned. Staff led time is needed to embed the programme. 	<ul> <li>Partnerships with parents</li> <li>The parenting course 'Webster Stratton' concluded in the Summer Term. Another round of this course will take place once all the necessary Early Help Assessments have been completed.</li> <li>Parents of children in Reception were invited to join their child and have a school dinner over their first few days in school. This was very positive and has helped the children to settle into the lunchtimes routines.</li> <li>Parents, children and staff have been encouraged to vote on the proposed logo designs for the MAT. We hope to be able to share the outcome of the vote soon.</li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>We hope to trial an online resource to aid communication between parents and teachers in response to parental feedback about the usefulness on the Tapestry resource that is only available in Early Years. Should the trial prove successful we will look to roll it out across other year groups.</li> <li>CK attended a conference called 'See Saw' looking at recording an on line journal for parents to view and comment on. Access would be for other year groups in school. A letter will be send out to parents to trial.</li> </ul>
